Contact your vet for more information on prevention." Thank you, <i>Kirk Sedentopf CSHA Region 1 President</i> president@cshareg1.com</p> <p>From Texas Farm News: Pigeon fever is not a disease of pigeons, but one that affects horses. It is called pigeon fever because the disease commonly affects the chest region of the horse and the swelling looks like a puffed out pigeon breast. The disease is also called dryland distemper and is caused by the bacteria corynebacterium pseudotuberculosis. The disease is common in California but is also seen in Texas. It is believed that insects carry and transmit the bacteria between horses. It commonly causes large abscesses in the chest region but can cause abscesses anywhere including internally. The external abscesses can be lanced and drained. It is important to not use antibiotics until all abscesses are drained as antibiotics will delay maturation of the abscesses. WARNING – NEW LEGISLATION IN EFFECT SEPT. 1ST

A new state law, approved July 2006, is now in effect. It is illegal to throw hypodermic needles, lancets, and other medical “sharps” into household trash cans. Waste Management was one of the bill’s sponsors. There is a sharp mail-back program Needle users will receive one free disposal kit per year – a postage-paid sharps container. Additional kits can be purchased for \$5 each. According to the way I interpreted the article I read, there may be a limit to how many kits per year you can purchase.
